 You must: meet a minimum net worth threshold of CAD\$600,000 if invited to apply, you must include a review of personal net worth completed by a qualified accounting firm propose a business plan that has a strong likelihood of sustained commercial viability as part of your business plan, propose to make a minimum personal investment of CAD\$200,000 in eligible expenses and create at least one new job in the proposed B.C. business if you are proposing a Key Staff as part of your application, the investment requirement increases to \$400,000 and the job creation to three demonstrate that you will have an active management role in the day-to-day operations of the business in B.C. Process Overview

You must submit a registration, or pre-application, to the BC PNP. Registrations are scored on the basis of human capital, as well as business and economic factors. Registrants are notified of their score within six weeks. Periodically, based on program capacity, the highest scoring registrants are invited to submit an application.

Applications are assessed based on program criteria, and if approved, you must sign a performance agreement with the Province. You must actively manage your B.C. business for a minimum of 18 months while on a BC PNP-supported two-year work permit, and demonstrate residency within 100km of your business for at least 75 per cent of the work permit period.

You must submit a final report that describes your business activities during your work permit period. If you are approved as a provincial nominee, the BC PNP issues a nomination certificate so that you and your dependent family members can apply to the federal government for permanent residence. To maintain your BC PNP nomination, you are required to continue to operate your business and reside in B.C.

Strategic Projects

The Strategic Projects category is an immigration pathway for key staff of successful foreign corporations that have identified strategic investment opportunities in B.C. that are key to the growth and expansion of their core businesses.

To be invited to apply, companies must demonstrate a commercially-viable business plan that is key to the growth and expansion of their core business and demonstrates a significant contribution to B.C.'s economy.

Past successful applicants include companies in advanced manufacturing, technology, new media, specialized engineering, forestry, and scientific research and development.
